ASK DR. RASKIN

WHAT IS UNIQUE ABOUT YOUR TRAINING?

My degree in physics, attending UC Irvine Medical School, becoming an internist and later completing my dermatology training at UCLA combine to give me a broad background to draw upon when treating patients. In fact, I am a fellow of the American Society for Mohs Surgery and skilled in micrographic surgery, which is unique in its accuracy and skin cancer cure rates, so I am able to care for patients beyond just their cosmetic woes.

WHAT IS NEW AT YOUR PRACTICE?

We recently moved to a new customdesigned office that gives our patients additional space for better privacy and comfort with three separate waiting rooms, larger exam rooms and a skin-care education area with various products for them to learn about.


WHAT SKIN-CARE PRODUCTS DO YOU OFFER?

I'm really big on antioxidants and retinol creams for patients, and I feel strongly that they provide enhanced benefits to skin. In addition to our own line, Creating Beauty, we carry a range of product lines from inexpensive ones to the more sophisticated lines such as SkinMedica[®].

Gentler skin resurfacing

Dr. Raskin says one of the most popular treatments he offers is fractional CO₂ laser resurfacing. "It's a sophisticated and elegant way to treat wrinkles, scars and surface deformities on the skin," he says. And it's a much gentler option than the old laser treatments. "The old lasers were kind of like a paintbrush where you did lasing over the entire surface of the skin and treated wrinkles by vaporizing the top layers of skin. It gave a nice result, but it was very painful," Dr. Raskin says. This results in open skin that needs more time to heal and increased risk of infection. With the fractionated laser, the beams of light are spaced out so treated skin is next to healthy, untreated skin, which speeds up recovery and minimizes pain associated with the treatment. "The only drawback is that we need multiple sessions to get the same result," Dr. Raskin says. "However, most patients choose this gentler method."
